Instructions:

Use the website offered and explore the unit on Leadership.

Pay attention to the three examples of leaders who were prominent during the Republic of the Rio Grande: Canales and Zapata, who fought for freedom and independence on behalf of the Republic of the Rio Grande; and Santa Anna, who fought in resistance to change, as the leader of the Republic of Mexico.

It is well known that Santa Anna, who would eventually be the five-time president of Mexico, switched allegiances at times and yet always used force and fear to rule. He was vehemently opposed to the Republic of the Rio Grande's establishment since its formation was a break from his government and political ideologies. He punished the emerging Republic with strategic attacks, eventually tricking and capturing Antonio Zapata, the Republic of the Rio Grande's military strategist. Once captured, Zapata was executed.

In keeping with Santa Anna's strategies to rule with fear, Zapata's head was carried in a whiskey barrel and delivered outside of his home. There, it was placed on a stake, instilling terror in those who might dare challenge him. This scare tactic is not unlike those that other ruthless rulers have used over time. Fear is a powerful tool that enables dictators to subjugate the people.

Canales and Zapata eventually lost to Santa Anna, and the Republic of the Rio Grande dissolved after less than a year. However, their valiant commitment to issues that mattered to them was quite remarkable.
